

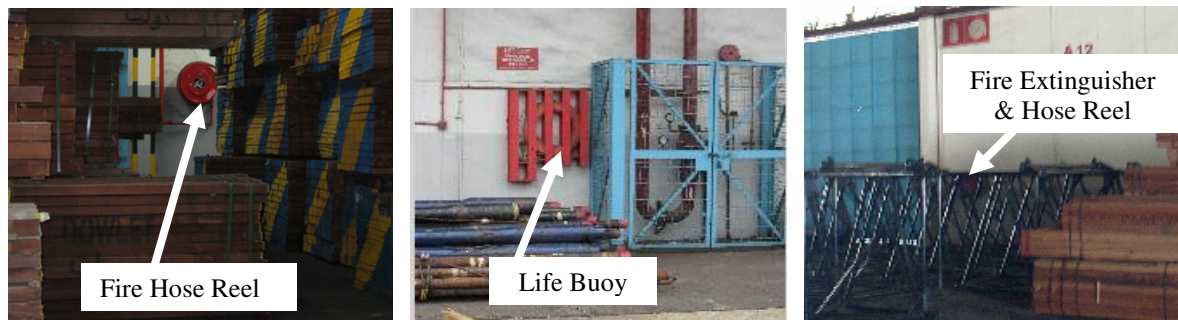

## **CARGO OBSTRUCTING LIFE SAVING AND FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT**

- 1 It has been observed that the life saving and fire fighting equipment (mainly inside and around the warehouses) are obstructed by cargo. This unsafe practice may lead to difficulties in accessing the equipment and results in delays in responding to emergency situations.
- 2 The pictures below shown some of the unsafe practice:



- 3 Please ensure that you do not store cargo near the equipment and obstruct access to the equipment. Please comply with the above regulation including the safety guidelines stated in No. 4.
- 4 Some safety guidelines of cargo storage in warehouses and open yards:
  - All cargo stored shall not obstruct the aisle ways, the entrance to any door, life saving and fire fighting equipment.
  - All emergency exits must be kept clear of cargo and a passageway maintained
  - One meter of fire-break between every 4 stacks of palletized cargo, bundles of timber or easily combustible cargo must be provided for.
