Dear Port Users

ENFORCEMENT OF CIRCUIT BREAKER MEASURES INCLUDING DONNING OF MASKS WITHIN JURONG PORT PREMISE

In accordance with the stringent circuit breaker measures implemented by Singapore's Multi-Ministry Taskforce, Jurong Port will strictly enforce the following measures within its port premises with immediate effect.

A. Wearing of Face Masks

- All personnel **MUST** wear a face mask at all times when commuting in and around common areas within Jurong Port's premise e.g. canteen, turn stile, pass office etc.
- Wearing of face mask **is compulsory** for all personnel when transiting to and from the wharf side and the vessel and in any involvement of work in loading and discharging operations.
- **Exception:** In line with the [advisory](#) set forth by the Ministry of Health (MOH) on 14th April 2020, individuals may remove their face masks while engaging in strenuous work but must put it back on after the work is done. An example of such strenuous work would be the execution of unloading operations in vessel hatches.
- **Penalties:**
 - i. Entry to Jurong Port will be refused to any port user who does not wear a face mask
 - ii. Jurong Port will not hesitate to impose a Notice of Infringement and a fine to any port user who fail to comply with measures

Note from [MOH advisory](#) dated 14th April 2020:

The wearing of mask is mandatory when outside of one's home. This applies on public transport, taxis, private hire cars, walking to or at markets, and also for essential workers at all workplace premises, whether they are frontline staff (such as food handlers, cashiers and bus drivers) or performing back office functions (such as data entry personnel and payroll executives). Individuals may remove their mask while engaging in strenuous exercise outdoors (e.g. running/ jogging), but they must put it back on after completing exercise.

This requirement will be in effect during this circuit breaker period. First-time offenders will be issued composition offers of \$300 by government enforcement officers, and repeat offenders will face higher fines or prosecution in court for egregious cases.

B. Adherence to Safe Distancing Measures

Safe distancing measures should be observed at all times. These include:

- Interactions between individuals

Be mindful to maintain a distance between yourself and others and minimise physical interactions. Keep at least one metre away from the person you are interacting with and have your face mask on.

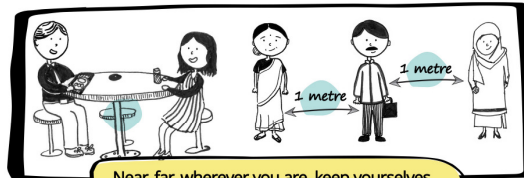


KEEPING A SAFE DISTANCE

- On Shuttle Buses

Similar to the measures taken on Public Transport, shuttle buses must adhere to half capacity rule and seats are marked with Safe Distancing Stickers. **Wearing of masks on shuttle buses is compulsory.** We have observed some port users who refused to adhere to the bus drivers' instructions to not board the bus when the bus is 'full' and even hurled vulgarities at the drivers when told to alight. Such

behaviours will not be tolerated and our enforcement officers on the ground will take necessary actions against such port users.

- On Lorries

Based on the Ministry of Manpower (MOM) on Advisory on safe distancing measures for workers ferried by lorries published on 10th April 20, **employers and lorry owners must adopt safe distancing measures at the back of lorries.**


SAFE DISTANCING FOR WORKERS ON LORRIES

The Ministry of Manpower and the Land Transport Authority issued an advisory on safe distancing measures for workers ferried by lorries on 10 April 2020.


Employers must:

- Review maximum seating capacity to ensure occupants are seated at least 1m apart
- Clearly mark sitting locations
- Arrange for additional trips or lorries, if necessary
- Ensure workers wear masks at all times
- Communicate these safe distancing measures to your workers and drivers

*Note: These are examples of how safe distancing on lorries can be practised.

⚠ An employer who contravenes the COVID-19 (Temporary Measures) Act 2020 faces a fine of up to \$10,000 or jail term of up to 6 months, or both. For second or subsequent offences, the penalties will be doubled.
